Description: WCVM is currently accepting applications for a 1 year veterinary medical imaging internship. Applicants must have a DVM (or equivalent) and a 1 year rotating internship or equivalent practice experience. Experience in medical imaging is preferred. This individual is expected to be highly motivated and have an interest in pursuing a veterinary radiology residency position. The goals of this internship are to develop advanced skills in ultrasound and radiograph interpretation through the involvement in the day-to-day running of a medical imaging specialty service. They will also gain experience in CT, Nuclear Medicine, MRI and fluoroscopy in both small and large animals. The intern will have the opportunity to participate in faculty research projects as well prepare a publication. This internship is designed to provide the candidate with an advantage in the veterinary radiology residency application process, allowing them to excel in their residency education.

The Veterinary Medical Centre at the Western College of Veterinary Medicine has a growing medical imaging caseload in small, large and exotic/wildlife patients. The advanced imaging equipment includes a 320 slice Toshiba Aquilion One CT scanner, Millenium MPR/MPS Gamma Camera with Genie AcQ software, Philips BV Pulsera C-arm Fluoroscope, Toshiba Aplio 300 and Philips iU22 ultrasound machines with multiple specialized probes, Canon Plate DR systems for large and small animal radiography. MRI technology includes in-house Siemens Symphony 1.5 Tesla MRI for small animals and a standing equine MRI in the Ryan-Dube Equine Performance Centre. The McKesson Horizon Medical Imaging PACS provides access throughout the College for consultation, diagnosis and teaching on clinical and research cases. The college offers specialty services in oncology, radiation oncology, small and large animal surgery, small and large animal internal medicine, dentistry, ophthalmology, exotics, nutrition and neurology.
