Small animal surgical internship

Description

The Western College of Veterinary Medicine (WCVM) is accepting applications for a one-year small animal surgery internship, which is a graduate certificate program. Intern applicants must have a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) degree or equivalent, and they must have completed a rotating internship. This individual is expected to be highly motivated with a demonstrated interest in pursuing a small animal surgical residency position.

The internship's goals are to develop advanced skills in small animal surgery through the involvement in the day-to-day running of a surgical service under the mentorship of ACVS-certified surgeons. They will gain experience in clinical examination, diagnostic investigations, and the interpretation of medical imaging studies (radiographs, ultrasonography, CT, MRI and PET-CT). They will gain intra-operative experience assisting on scheduled and emergency surgeries. They will participate in the postoperative care and client communications of surgical patients. After-hours surgery emergency duty will be a component of this internship.

The WCVM offers a salary of \$28,000.00 CAD, and the intern receives professional liability insurance and a student health and dental plan. A WCVM bursary covers the intern's licensing fees with the Saskatchewan Veterinary Medical Association as well as tuition and student fees. The intern receives three weeks of vacation organized with the small animal surgery service. Unused vacation time will not be paid out and cannot be taken during the program's last week.

About the WCVM and the VMC

The WCVM's Veterinary Medical Centre (VMC) has a diverse and interesting caseload in primary and referral small animal surgery. The VMC offers specialty services in anesthesia, medical imaging, ophthalmology, medical oncology, radiation oncology, small animal internal medicine, dentistry, critical care, nutrition, exotics, sports medicine and rehabilitation.
